Keep healthy. Pray mightily. Enjoy your life today. Winter is upon us. And let's experience the love and power of God together while we are apart.

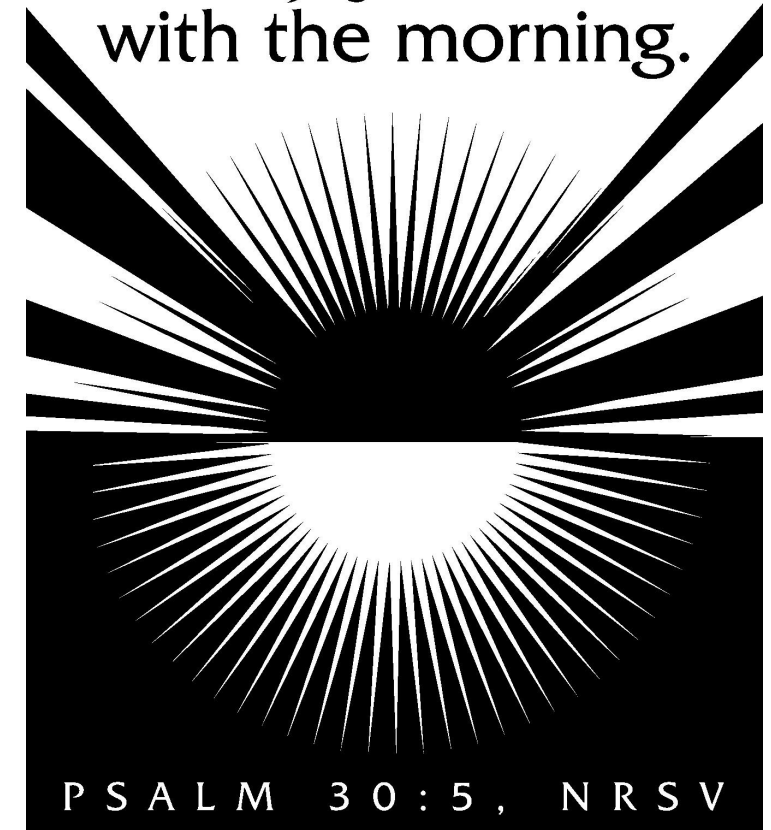
